Newton Class

What a fantastic September we have had in Newton Class! We could not be prouder of how all of our children have settled in to the Autumn Term and we have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know each and every one of them! Our 'Me and my family' topic has helped us to find out lots about each other and we have now finished our book, 'So much', which has allowed us to explore extended families and look at celebrations that take place within the home.



The Autumn weather has been [mostly] kind to us this month and the children have been able to play, learn and explore outside on a daily basis. The orchard, jungle, mud kitchen and field areas are our favourite with many wonderful learning activities taking place. Indoors we have completed baseline assessments with Reception children and have started our daily phonics and reading sessions where the children are already making fantastic progress. We have also been teaching daily maths sessions with a focus on number and place value for the Year One children whilst 'Matching and Sorting' activities have been worked on in Reception.



For the remainder of this half term we will be using the very popular book 'Oi Frog' for our literacy focus. This book is a rhyming text as well as being very funny - it's already a favourite for many of our children! If you are looking for new books to enjoy at home, the series by the author, Kes Gray, are highly recommended. We are delighted to see that all of our children have a passion for reading and are thoroughly enjoying reading at school. Books will be assigned to read at home at the end of this week - with a school reader as an ebook

and book to share in the book bag. The ebook will be the book read by your child all week in school and so this can be practised at home, when you wish. Please do use the shared reading book for snuggles and bedtime reading when we all love to share books together! This is so important in terms of ensuring children develop that 'reading for pleasure' skill.

Our children will be learning more about their school and where we live this month, alongside looking at how our senses help us learn more about the world and developing our artistic skills ready to create a self-portrait at the end of this half term - we really are very clever pupils! Remember to wear PE kits to school each Tuesday and Wednesday's and to bring a warm and waterproof coat and water bottle every day.

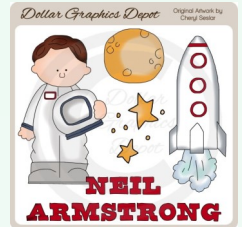

If you have any queries, please do come and speak to a member of the Newton Class team - we are always happy to discuss things and support in any way that we can.

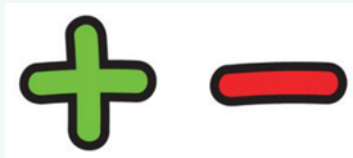

Armstrong Class

It has been fantastic to have everyone back in Armstrong Class, the last month has flown by and I am so proud of how well the children have settled back into life at St Kew!

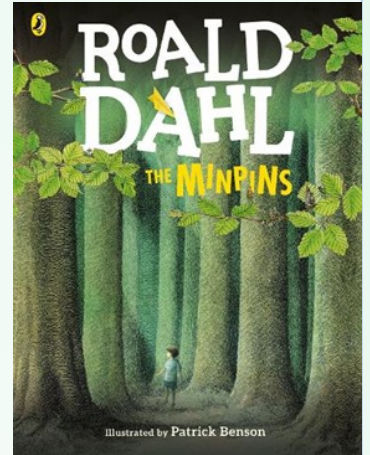


Our topic for this term is 'Bravery vs Fear'. We have just finished writing our own version of 'The Bear Under The Stairs' and are just starting our next book: 'The Minpins' by Roald Dahl. We will focus on creative writing and write setting descriptions of the magical forest.



In Maths, we will focus on addition and subtraction. We will add and subtract numbers with and without exchanging using practical equipment and written

methods. The year 2s will add and subtract 2-digit numbers, the year 3s will add and subtract 3-digit numbers and the year 4s will add and subtract 4-digit numbers.



In Science, we are learning about animals including humans. We will be learning about the different food groups and understand that humans need the right amount of nutrition. In History, we are learning about Christopher Columbus. We will be discovering where he sailed and what life was like on board his ship. Afterwards, we will discuss why and how we remember Columbus. Our RSHE focus this half term is 'Being Me in My World'. We will learn how to work cooperatively in a group and understand how our actions affect ourselves and other people. In Art, we are continuing to learn about the artist Katsushika Hokusai. We have created a profile about his life and work, and we will progress to creating our own version of the 'The Great Wave off Kanagawa'. In Computing, we are learning to design algorithms made of simple shapes.



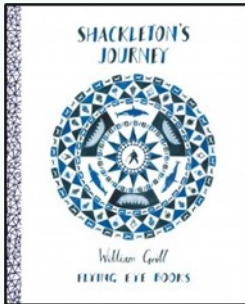
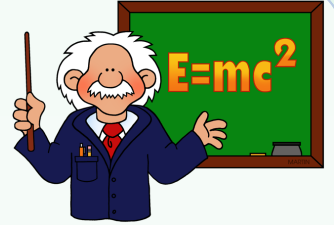

Everyone will also need to bring a water bottle with them every day. We will continue to change reading books on Fridays so please only send book bags in then. The children's PE days will continue to be on Tuesdays and Wednesdays this term. Please bring your child into school wearing their sports clothes on those days.

Einstein Class

The children have settled well into the start of the new term and have been really engaged in their learning under this term's theme of 'Exploration and Discovery.' Well done on a great start everyone!



We started with the book 'Shackleton's Journey' by William Grill. The children began the topic by getting into role as one of the crew members and applying to Shackleton's recruitment poster. They have role played interviewing each other for the post and have had interesting discussions around what items they would have taken and why. They have written telegrams home to their loved ones, descriptions of their first sighting of Antarctica and diary entries. The children have created a conscience alley where they have given advice to Shackleton as to whether they should remain at Patience Camp.

We will begin our second text 'Jonathan Swift's Gulliver' later this half term. This will be a stimulus for our story writing. Our Year 6 children enjoyed a fabulous day of workshops at this year's 'North Cornwall Book Festival' where they also received many ideas for writing as well as a free book of their choice, which they were able to get signed by the author.



We began the design process for this year's 'Bikelights' at the start of this term and have enjoyed 2 full days of workshops with local artist Reg Payne. The children have created something truly spectacular around this year's theme; 'The Atlantic Highway' and we would like to invite you to join us in Wadebridge for the parade on Saturday 15th October.

Argyle coaches are teaching basketball on Tuesdays, and we have a football specialist in on Wednesdays for this term. Our RSHE lessons focus on 'Being me in my world' this half term and the children have looked at their own aspirations for the future as well as considering the lives of other children in different parts of the world. Our big question for RE is: 'What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today?' In science our topic is 'Evolution and Inheritance.'

Homework will continue to be set every Monday. It is a handwriting sheet on one side with 10 spellings to learn, which every child will be tested on, on the following Monday. The reverse has a set of times tables to complete in less than 3 minutes. The sums they don't complete they finish in another colour. This half term's focus will be to learn and practise times tables. It is great to see so many reading cards filling up - well done to all of you who read every single day, having just completed fluency checks with you all, it does make a difference. Keep practising. We aim to hold auditions for this year's Christmas Play before the half term holiday, so that the children can practise their part and the many songs during the holiday.

It was lovely to see so many parents at this year's welcome meeting. The presentation used is on our class page on the school's website. If you do have any questions regarding homework or anything else please come and speak to one of the 'Einstein Class' team.

Lunchtime Arrangements

We place a great emphasis on table manners and encouraging children to enjoy the social side of sharing a meal with friends. To support us in school, we would like to ask parents to encourage children to use a knife and fork when eating. We expect all children eating hot meals at school to use a knife and fork and staff are always available to help cut up food for the younger children, where necessary.

Water is available for all children at lunchtime and those with packed lunches are expected to put any uneaten food or rubbish back into their lunchboxes so that you know exactly what has been eaten each day. We do not allow fizzy drinks, glass bottles or NUTS as these pose a safety risk.

Please also avoid sweets and bars of chocolate as we try to encourage healthy balanced meals at lunchtime.

N.B We have FRUIT/VEG ONLY break times at St Kew.

We know, it only seems like yesterday that you were dropping them off in Reception! BUT they'll be more than ready to start Year 7 in September 2023!

31st October 2022

Attendance

Attendance at school is vital to enable a child to:

- learn and achieve
- develop social skills by interacting with their peers and adults
- develop learning habits that will last into later life; equipping them to compete in employment and the working world.



We encourage good attendance by making time in school fun, safe and interesting.

You can help prevent your child missing time in school by:

- Making sure they understand the importance of good attendance / punctuality
- Taking an interest in their education - ask about school work and encourage them to get involved in school activities - clubs, trips and homework.
- Discussing any problems they may have with their class teacher, TA, or Mrs Murray sooner rather than later
- Not letting them take time off school for minor ailments - if you are unsure whether your child should attend school, please call the office.
- Arranging appointments and outings after school hours, at weekends or during school holidays.

Government guidance identifies that parents do not have an automatic right to holiday during term time and permission will only be given in very exceptional circumstances. We recognise that it's often expensive to take a holiday during school breaks and that's why some parents may ask for term-time leave for their child. However, it is important that parents carefully consider the implications of taking their child out of school during term time. Research suggests that children who are taken out of school may never catch up on the work they have missed. Those who struggle with English or Maths may also find it even harder to cope when they return to school and may find it difficult to renew friendships with their classmates. There are also times during a school year when a child may experience particular problems because of term-time leave such as:

- During SATs and other statutory assessments
- During the first year at a new school

Please ensure you contact school, if you are considering taking a holiday. We do consider every request for term time absence on a case by case basis so that we can make sure the reasons for the request can be understood.

Why is it important that your child arrives at school on time?

- Arriving late at school may be embarrassing for your child.
- It may disrupt the class if your child arrives late.
- Your child may miss something important e.g. instructions on how to complete a piece of work.
- Social interaction with peers before school is important if your child is to form friendship groups.
- To instill good habits. Punctuality shows reliability. This is a valuable attribute for future working life.

These features can prevent your child from downloading or buying anything unsuitable for their age. Updated versions of apps or games that your child has already installed may occasionally contain something inappropriate, so we've explained how to stop those, too.

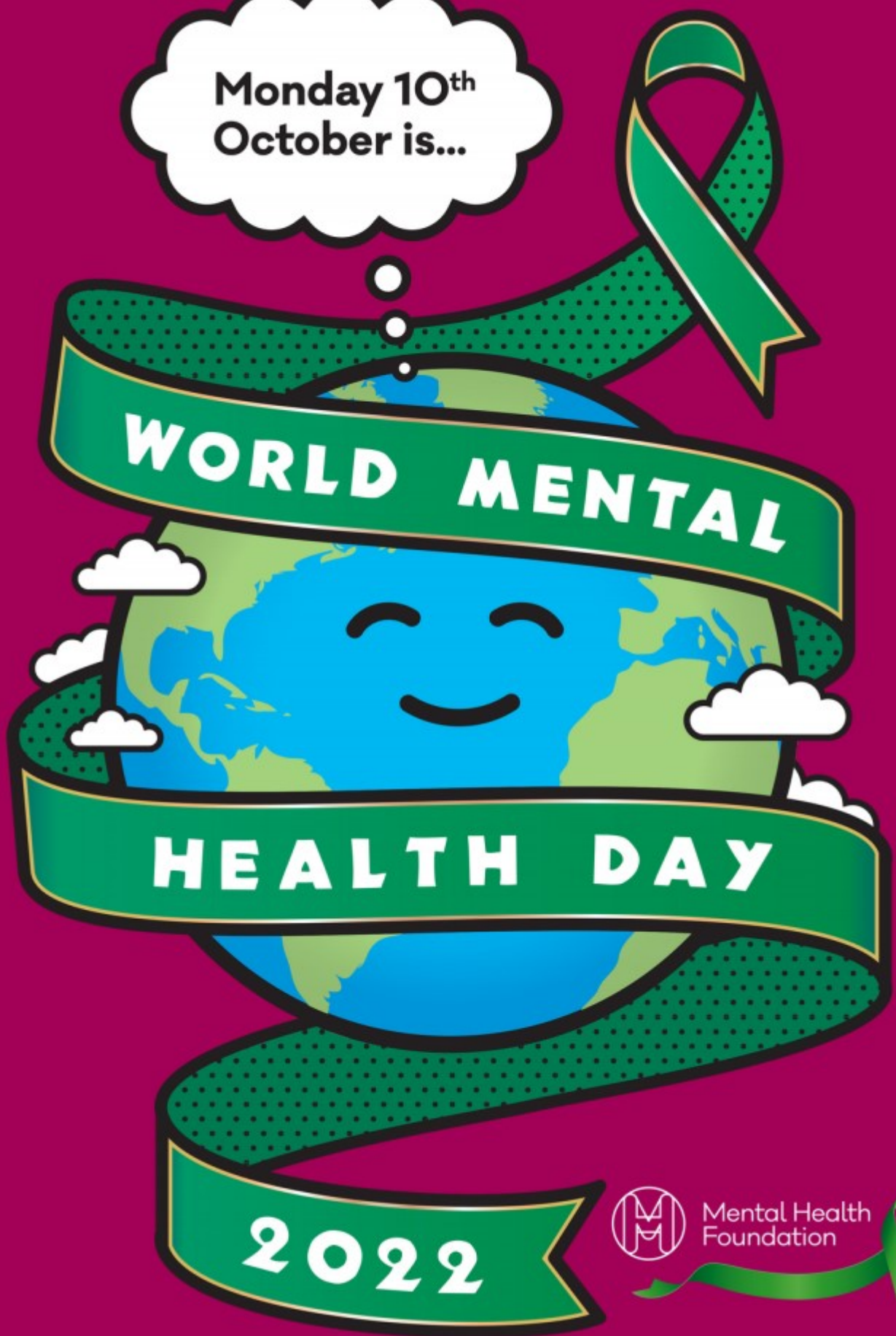

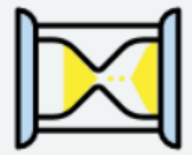

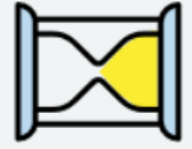
